



- 1. JCA established the voluntary Traffic Separation Schemes on the Japanese South Coast from 1970.
- 2. These Traffic Separation Schemes were revised in 1986 and 2002.
- 3. In 2012, the Japan Association of Marine Safety started a study to review the current sea-traffic conditions in the areas where JCA voluntary Traffic Separation Scheme is established.




Index of Designated Area




East Bound (  $500 \sim 1,000 \text{ GT}$  )




West Bound (  $500 \sim 1,000 \text{ GT}$  )




East Bound (10,000  $\sim$  50,000 GT)

## Points associated with JCA Traffic Separation Schemes

- **1** JCA Separation Scheme is voluntary.
- 2 Misunderstood that it is official and compulsory under COLREG
- 3 Some PSC Officers say it is inappropriate to add these TSS to a chart with ink.
- **4** General traffic flow today may differ from JCA Separation Scheme.
